## Beardall Fields Primary School Art Curriculum Statement

## 1. Intent

The aim of our Art curriculum at Beardall Fields is:



- For children to study a diverse range of artists, sculptors, designers and craft-makers from their own and other cultures
- For children to develop an inquisitive nature in the different elements of art
- For children to 'experience' art in its many forms, particularly in the areas of drawing, painting, print-making, 3D, textiles and collage
- For all children to showcase their talent and potential as artists

## 2. <u>Implementation</u>
