1. <u>Intent</u>

The aim of our History curriculum at Beardall Fields is:

- For children to develop a love towards history and be inspired and curious about the different individuals and cultures they encounter
- For children throughout school to use different types of sources and to understand their importance
- For all children to have a better chronological understanding of British History and the world

2. Implementation

The ways in which we implement these in school is through:

- Ensuring every classroom has its own timeline clearly on display
- History units of work being introduced not in isolation, but in how they overlap other units of work previously studied
- Ensuring 'Big Question' assessments are open-ended and allow children to show what they do know
- Use of a retrieval quiz at the start of every History lesson- including key words and also linked to our Big Questions
- Assemblies, themed days/weeks, trips, residentials and visitors
- Experiencing different sources and artefacts
- 3. <u>Impact</u>

The impact of this will be:

- Children's history knowledge and skills will increase throughout their time at Beardall Fields
- Children will be able to identify the periods of history they have studied in relation to one another
- Children will be able to know more and remember more across the History curriculum
- The children throughout school will know what sources are and how to use them; Year 6 will also be able to analyse their reliability
