## Beardall Fields Primary School Religious Education Curriculum Statement

## 1. Intent

The aim of our Religious Education curriculum at Beardall Fields is:

- For children to have developed knowledge and understanding of the different faiths in our school, Britain and the world,
- For children to have developed attitudes of respect for individual beliefs if different from their own view or faith,
- For children to develop an inquisitive nature into artefacts from different faiths,
- For children to experience and discover more about Religious Education and world views on a range of topics,
- For all children to experience what it is like to be a follower of a religion through artefacts and experiences.

## 2. Implementation

The ways in which we implement these in school is through:

- A clear long-term plan to teach knowledge and skills from the Nottinghamshire RE SACRE syllabus which built upon from previous units.
- Clear assessment aims for the end of year groups and key stages.
- The use and handling of artefacts to enhance learning experiences.
- Through high quality R.E. lessons where children;
  - discuss and debate key questions, world views and a pupil's own views.
  - explore and make links between RE and other subjects e.g. art, music and history. - explore and make links between how belief can affect individual character
  - development and affect society and culture.
  - express beliefs and views through art.
- Assemblies which impart knowledge and celebrate the faiths across the school community.
- RE experiences through visitors and visits to learn more about faith, religious practice and places of worship.

## 3. <u>Impact</u>

The impact of this will be:

- Children will leave Beardall Fields with a depth of knowledge about different faiths and cultures of people in Britain and the wider world.
- Children will be equipped to understand the wider world that they can travel to, work in and explore when they are older.
- Children will leave Beardall Fields with the knowledge and skills to be best placed to progress with their learning in the KS3 Religious Education syllabus.
- Children will be able to explain how British Values of respect and tolerance relate to people of faith, beliefs and world views.
- Children will demonstrate attitudes of respect towards others in school and wider community.
- Children will be able to communicate and express views articulately and with respect towards others with different viewpoints.
- A rise of children meeting or exceeding expectations for Religious Education attainment
