**It can very quickly lead to the victim feeling trapped, scared and vulnerable to grooming and blackmail.**

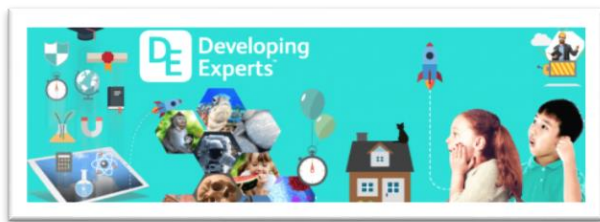
